## Highlights

- Sarjan Outreach wrapped up its year with **Sarjanatmak Samvad**, a learning fair focused on emotion recognition, alongside learning styles, self-awareness, and gratitude
- Sarjan Lab enrolled new admissions for a year-long program focused on deep social-emotional learning
- Sarai organized a session on **managing workplace stress** for the team from Billion Lives Foundation.
- Organized an introductory Sambhav session for **70 youth** from various tribal communities at **VIVEC**
- The 6-month Sambhav Youth in Action program culminated, celebrating **49 participants** who impacted **1,800 lives** in and around Vadodara. The event drew nearly 200 attendees from diverse backgrounds

## Sarjan for Children

- Children deeply explored decision-making. This helps them learn to weigh options, understand consequences, and build confidence in their choices, preparing them for future challenges.
- Through **storytelling, reading, and writing**, children actively developed their **linguistic skills**. These activities enhance vocabulary, improve comprehension, encourage creative expression, and lay a strong foundation for effective communication.
- Through activities like playing with mud provided a rich, **tactile, sensory experience**, children connected more deeply with their environment and fostering creativity.
- Creating **best out of waste** helps children develop creativity while fostering early habits of environmental responsibility and sustainability.





## Sambhav for Youth

- Wrapped up **Tap the Mirror** series in Vadodara, where youth explored self-understanding, emotional intelligence, and confidence-building.
- About **70 young people** from various **tribal communities** had the chance to connect with themselves through an introductory session at VIVEC.
- On April 27th, we celebrated **49 participants of our Youth in Action (YIA) project** at the FGI auditorium, highlighting their experiences and the impact they made on 1,800 lives in and around Vadodara.
- Kicked off the new academic year by announcing a new **Youth in Action** cohort on June 16th.

- In June, we also organized three engaging Youth Adda sessions.

## Celebration Of Year-Long Journey

**Ranu:** Kanyashala (girls' primary), Kumarshala (boys' primary), and Grade 9 at Shri Sarvajanik High School.

**Narsipura:** Narsipura (co-ed) Primary School.

**Latipura:** Grades 9-12 at Shree Sarvoday Highschool.

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On March 25th, over **1000 children** from five schools showcased their year-long learning through a creative fair. The event drew approximately **150 attendees**, including guests from **RISHI FIBC Ltd.**, **AURA** well-wishers, **MS University** professors, school principals and teachers, college students, and representatives from various organizations.

The main focus of the fair was on **emotion recognition**. Along with that, themes such as learning styles, **self-awareness** and **gratitude** were the focus of the fair's activities

- Adding to the fair's vibrancy, an **art exhibition** featured pieces created by students from the five schools.
- These artworks explored themes such as **Friendship**, **Curious Me**, and **Because I am a girl, I want to study**.
- The stalls were entirely managed by **students from Grades 5 to 9 and 11**.
- This year's fair also included **drama performances**, a new and engaging addition.
- Many visitors noted a significant improvement in the children's **presentation skills**, **confidence**, and **overall approach** to showcasing their topics compared to the previous year.
